Anne Arundel **\$100,000**

Arundel Community Development Services (ACDS) is a private, nonprofit corporation established by Anne Arundel County to create and retain affordable housing opportunities within the County, and to ensure the efficient delivery of community development services to those most in need. ACDS will upgrade at least 10 households in the Spring Meadows community and up to 3 homeowners participating in the ACDS Property Rehabilitation Program using Whole Home/Whole Building upgrades that will consist of performing energy audits on the home or building and then installing the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures.

Anne Arundel **\$ 50,000**

Today's Dream Tomorrow's Future (TDTF) is a community development and social service non-profit organization based in Glen Burnie, Maryland. TDTF will use funding from MEA to conduct energy audits and install energy efficiency measures based on audit findings in at least 6 homes.

Baltimore County **\$170,000**

Civic Works is Baltimore's Service Corps and an AmeriCorps organization, was founded in 1993 to strength Baltimore's communities through education, skills development and community service. Civic Works aims to upgrade approximately 306 homes via Project Lightbulb, a program that uses community outreach to implement lighting upgrades, faucet aerators, low flow showerheads, and hot water pipe wrap in low to moderate income homes.

Baltimore County **\$100,000**

Diversified Housing Development (DHD) is a nonprofit founded in 2002 to promote affordable housing options for low and moderate-income families. DHD will complete Whole Home/Whole Building upgrades consisting of performing energy audits on the home or buildings and then installing the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures to at least 13 low to moderate income households.

Baltimore County **\$50,000**

Today's Dream Tomorrow's Future (TDTF) is a community development and social service non-profit organization based in Glen Burnie, Maryland. TDTF will use funding from MEA to conduct energy audits and install energy efficiency measures based on audit findings in at least 6 homes.

Baltimore City **\$125,000**

Baltimore City Department of Public Works will conduct energy audits and install cost effective energy efficiency measures based on audit findings in various public buildings, such as youth service centers and libraries, with programs and facilities serving low and moderate income residents.

Baltimore City**\$265,000**

Civic Works, founded in 1993, Civic Works is comprised of both the Baltimore's Service Corps and an AmeriCorps, works to strengthen Baltimore's communities through education, skills development and community service. Civic Works aims to provide energy retrofits to approximately 37 Baltimore City homes. Approximately half the homes will receive only LED lightbulbs, low-flow showerheads, and faucet aerators. The remaining homes will receive these retrofits as well as air sealing and insulation under the Home Performance with ENERGY STAR model.

Baltimore City**\$80,000**

Unity Properties, a subsidiary of Community Works' housing and community development, provides safe and affordable housing to low-income families, seniors and people with disabilities. Unity Properties will conduct deep retrofits of approximately 10 row houses on West Baltimore Street to include weatherizing measures and upgrades to HVAC, appliances and lighting.

Calvert**\$25,000**

Town of North Beach is promoting a healthy, attractive, sustainable North Beach through green initiatives and public education. The Town of North Beach will complete Whole Home/Whole Building upgrades consisting of performing an energy audit and then installing the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization upgrades in at least three homes.

Caroline**\$25,000**

Community Action Council of Howard County (CAC) is a not-for-profit community action agency that manages many grants and programs that benefit low income residents. With MEA funds, CAC of Howard County will replace at least 17 PTAC HVAC units at Federalsburg Square, an apartment complex in Federalsburg, Maryland.

Carroll**\$45,000**

Human Services Program of Carroll County is an Action Agency and United Way Family Stability Partner, providing county-wide services to meet basic human needs for housing, utility assistance and eviction prevention as well as counseling, referral and educational assistance to address the root causes of poverty. With MEA funding, Human Services Program of Carroll County will perform energy audits and then install the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures in at least 6 homes.

Cecil**\$55,000**

Choptank Electric Cooperative is a member-owned electric distribution utility that serves over 52,406 residential, commercial and industrial accounts in parts of all nine counties of Maryland's Eastern Shore. With MEA funding, Choptank Electric will perform Whole Home/Whole Building upgrades that will include energy audits and installation of the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures in at least 7 homes.

Charles**\$50,000**

Today's Dream Tomorrow's Future (TDTF) is a community development and social service non-profit organization based in Glen Burnie, Maryland. TDTF will use funding from MEA to conduct energy audits and install energy efficiency measures based on audit findings in at least 6 homes.

Dorchester**\$25,000**

Habitat for Humanity Choptank empowers low-income households to improve their housing conditions. Habitat for Humanity Choptank has grown in capacity from Talbot and Dorchester counties and has also diversified its projects beyond single family new construction to include rehabs as well as new construction multi-family builds. Habitat for Humanity Choptank will implement energy retrofits for approximately three owner-occupied homes. Two of these homes will be located in Hurlock and one will be located in Cambridge.

Frederick**\$85,000**

City of Frederick/Frederick Community Action Agency (FCAA) is a department of the City of Frederick, and will use their 2018 funds to complete approximately 14 electric whole-home weatherization retrofits and 4 fossil fuel whole-home weatherization retrofits through this project.

Harford**\$80,000**

Habitat for Humanity Susquehanna creates affordable housing opportunities throughout Harford and Cecil Counties by building, renovating and repairing homes in partnerships with the community. With MEA funding, Habitat for Humanity Susquehanna will implement energy retrofits in approximately 7 homes, complete a comprehensive energy efficient renovation in one home, and fund the incremental costs of energy efficiency measures installed in approximately three to-be-constructed home for low income Maryland residents.

Howard**\$65,000**

Community Action Council of Howard County (CAC) is a not for profit community action agency that manages many grants and programs that benefit low income residents. With MEA funds, CAC of Howard County will perform retail weatherization of single-family houses as part of whole home upgrades that include an audit and cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization upgrades in at least 8 homes.

Kent**\$25,000**

Choptank Electric Cooperative is a member-owned electric distribution utility that serves over 52,406 residential, commercial, and industrial accounts in parts of all nine counties of Maryland's Eastern Shore. With MEA funding, Choptank Electric will perform Whole Home/Whole Building upgrades that will include energy audits and installation of the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures in at least three homes.

Montgomery**\$55,000**

Habitat for Humanity Metro Maryland (HFHMM) strives to provide a sustainable solution to the housing crisis affecting Montgomery and Prince George's Counties. Habitat for Humanity Metro Maryland will conduct energy audits and then weatherize and make other energy efficiency improvements to 7 low to moderate income homes.

Montgomery**\$50,000**

Rebuilding Together Montgomery County (RTMC) is a non-profit housing organization that provides free critical home repairs and energy efficiency upgrades to Montgomery County's most vulnerable low-income residents. RTMC will provide approximately 20 low to moderate income homes with weatherization services, as well as cost-effective upgrades to HVAC and appliances as needed to enhance energy efficiency.

Prince George's**\$66,000**

Habitat for Humanity Metro Maryland (HFHMM) strives to provide a sustainable solution to the housing crisis affecting Montgomery and Prince George's Counties. Habitat for Humanity Metro Maryland will conduct energy audits and then weatherize and make other energy efficiency improvements to 8 low to moderate income homes.

Prince George's**\$50,000**

Today's Dream Tomorrow's Future (TDTF) is a community development and social service non-profit organization based in Glen Burnie, Maryland. TDTF will use funding from MEA to conduct energy audits and install energy efficiency measures based on audit findings in at least 6 homes.

Prince George's**\$184,000**

United Communities Against Poverty (UCAP) is a non-profit advocate for communities of people facing deficiencies in education, affordable housing, economic stability and health care access. UCAP will follow the Home Performance with ENERGY STAR model to upgrade approximately 24 low to moderate income homes. Home Performance projects require an energy audit, which is followed by the installation of measures recommended by the audit.

Choptank Electric Cooperative is a member-owned electric distribution utility that serves over 52,406 residential, commercial and industrial accounts in parts of all nine counties of Maryland's Eastern Shore. With MEA funding, Choptank Electric will perform Whole Home/Whole Building upgrades that will include energy audits and installation of the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures in at least three homes.

Somerset

\$25,000

SHORE UP! is a private, non-profit Community Action Partnership on Maryland's Eastern Shore, is dedicated to empowering individuals and families to maintain long-term independence and achieve economic self-sufficiency. SHORE UP! will conduct energy audits on approximately three low to moderate income homes and implement cost-effective weatherization and energy efficiency measures based on audit findings.

St. Mary's

\$45,000

Housing Authority of St. Mary's County (HASM) aims to improve communities through beneficial services and programs and preserve affordable homeownership and rental housing for all citizens in need. HASM will follow recommendations from existing audit reports to variously weatherize and upgrade lighting and HVAC systems in at least in 6 homes within Tubman Douglass Estates.

Talbot

\$25,000

Habitat for Humanity Choptank empowers low-income households to improve their housing conditions. It has grown in capacity from Talbot and Dorchester Counties and has also diversified its projects beyond single family new construction to include rehabs as well as new construction multi-family builds. Habitat for Humanity Choptank will improve energy efficiency in approximately three low-income owner-occupied homes. Two of these homes will be located in Easton and one will be located in St. Michaels.

Washington

\$13,430

Community Free Clinic focuses on assisting the underserved, medically uninsured population of Washington County. With MEA funding, Community Free Clinic will upgrade three full-sized and two smaller refrigerators used for medication and specimen storage as well as the break room refrigerator all to ENERGY STAR qualified refrigerators.

Washington County Housing Solutions aims to support clients and programs of the Housing Authority of Washington County through advocacy, community outreach, and fund development. With MEA funding, Washington County Housing Solutions will perform an energy audit and then install the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures in 9 homes between Park View Knoll and Springs Manor.

Wicomico

Community Action Council of Howard County (CAC) is a not for profit community action agency that manages many grants and programs that benefit low income residents. With MEA funds, CAC of Howard County will replace approximately 42 PTAC HVAC units at Chestnut Manor, an apartment complex in Delmar, Maryland.

SHORE UP! is a private, non-profit Community Action Partnership on Maryland's Eastern Shore, is dedicated to empowering individuals and families to maintain long-term independence and achieve economic self-sufficiency. ACDS will upgrade at least 26 units owned by the Housing Authority of the City of Annapolis at the Robinwood community in Annapolis using Whole Home/Whole Building upgrades that will consist of performing energy audits and then installing the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures.

Statewide**\$165,000**

Choptank Electric Cooperative is a member-owned electric distribution utility that serves over 52,406 residential, commercial, and industrial accounts in parts of all nine counties of Maryland's Eastern Shore. With MEA funding, Choptank Electric will perform Whole Home/Whole Building upgrades that will include energy audits and installation of the most cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures in at least 21 homes in Caroline, Cecil, Dorchester, Kent, Queen Anne's, Somerset, Talbot, Wicomico, and Worcester Counties.

Civic Works, Baltimore's Service Corps and an AmeriCorps organization, was founded in 1993 to strength Baltimore's communities through education, skills development and community service. Civic Works aims to provide energy retrofits to approximately 16 homes by using the Whole Home/Whole Building approach.

Statewide**\$200,000**

Community Action Council of Howard County (CAC of HC) is a not-for-profit community action agency that manages many grants and programs that benefit low income residents. Community Action Council of Howard County will follow the Whole Home/Whole Building model to conduct energy audits and implement select energy efficiency upgrades in approximately 26 apartment homes and row houses in Anne Arundel, Baltimore City, Caroline, Cecil, Harford and Wicomico Counties.

Statewide**\$350,000**

Frederick County Office of Sustainability and Environmental Resources, advances practical solutions for protecting the environment, conserving energy, and living sustainably in Frederick County.

The Frederick County Government's Office of Sustainability and Environmental Resources will conduct energy audits and implement weatherization measures and energy efficiency upgrades to approximately 45 low to moderate homes in Frederick County using the Whole Home/Whole Building approach. They will also provide education on both energy efficiency measures and energy conservation behaviors that together can maximize electricity and fuel reductions and cost savings.

Healthy Neighborhoods is comprised of 29 non-profit educational, housing, community, and social services providers in Baltimore City, Healthy Neighborhoods will use their 2018 funds to conduct energy efficiency upgrades in approximately 14 facilities that house and serve individuals who are low-income, homeless, have mental, physical or developmental disabilities, or substance use disorders, as well as other special needs populations. The results of an energy audit for each building will determine the cost effective measures installed. By providing the administration and management of this grant, Healthy Neighborhoods will enable the funds for these projects to be stretched to cover additional measures through leveraged funds and economies of scale.

SAFE Housing- Allegany, Garrett, Washington, helps economically disadvantaged people obtain or create safe, energy efficient housing. SAFE Housing will implement Whole Home/Whole Building upgrades to achieve a 10-year payback on installed measures. SAFE Housing will also service households that have been deferred due to health and safety concerns. With MEA funding, SAFE Housing will upgrade 42 homes in Allegany, Garrett, and Washington Counties.

SAFE Housing- Princess Anne, helps economically disadvantaged people obtain or create safe, energy efficient housing. SAFE Housing will implement Whole Building/ Whole Home upgrades to improve energy efficiency in at least 26 homes in Princess Anne, Maryland.

Statewide

\$350,000

Town of Bladensburg (Prince George's County Municipal Collaboration), leads a collaborative of 19 municipal governments in Prince George's County. The collaborative aims to upgrade approximately 45 homes across Prince George's, Anne Arundel, Calvert, Charles and Montgomery Counties. Upgrades will be required to pay for themselves within 10 years of completion and will be guided by the recommendations of a comprehensive energy audit. Bladensburg will leverage utility program funds to install additional measures to maximize the energy efficiency opportunities on the upgraded homes.

Town of Edmonston, in Prince George's County will provide home energy audits and energy retrofits to approximately 6 homes to achieve energy use reductions of 20 percent or more in each home, following the Whole Home/Whole building approach.

United Communities Against Poverty (UCAP) is a non-profit advocate for communities of people facing deficiencies in education, affordable housing, economic stability, and health care access. UCAP will follow the Home Performance with ENERGY STAR model to upgrade low-rise apartment communities, ranging from a one building community of 200 dwellings to a 25 building community with 400 dwellings.

With MEA funds, Washington County Housing Solutions will use the Whole Home/Whole Building approach to retrofit 26 home units in Park View Knoll and Springfield Manor.

Wicomico County Housing Authority provides services of affordable housing operations for income based families. With MEA funding, Wicomico County Housing Authority will use the Whole Home/Whole Building approach to perform energy audits and install cost-effective energy efficiency and weatherization measures to at least 23 housing units.
